EXCLUSIVE DECAL LETTERING

Maine Central and Bangor & Aroostook HO fans will appreciate a recently published sheet of decals that will permit the accurate modeling of several of the railroads' locomotives and cars.

Maine modelers Peter Apuzzo of Falmouth and Ric Parady of Gorham created the decals with new artwork and printing by Microscale Industries. The decals will letter Pres. E. Spencer Miller's Maine Central locomotive 573 in the reverse harvest gold scheme (post-1977) with "Charlie Brown

Tree" cab heralds and hood end trees, MEC 959 and 961, PT gold nose Alco switchers, MEC 560 series GP7s, 9800 series 50-foot boxcars with open herald and Paul Bunyan figure with Peavey and with Axe, Waterville Shop crests with PPG paint code in the harvest gold and pine green scheme for various rolling stock, the number 554 for the MEC RS3 flank and end pine trees, PT herald without ring for snow plow no. 68, all numbers and heralds for the BAR troop sleeper cabooses, hood end heralds for the 470 Railroad Club repaint of MEC 573, and other Maine Central-Portland Terminal heralds and stripes in the proper colors never before printed. The set also includes lettering for PT boxcar cabooses PTM 1,2 and 3.

The decals can be seen at Pete's shop, Maine Modelworks, at 417 U.S. Route 1, Falmouth, Maine.

PRESERVATION

Roger Robar,, president of the North Conway Model Railroad club, has been officially named Consultant for the project to restore the B&M railroad station in Lisbon, N.H. The town of Lisbon recently purchased the landmark from its owner who had plans to move it to Vermont. The Station was built by the Boston, Concord & Montreal Railroad in 1853. The structure is known for its unusual architectural design with a steep curved roof and six dormers. Plans are not finalized, but hope to include a visitors center, a meeting area and a small railroad museum. The town has received \$170,000 in grants with others pending.

HAPPY BIRTHDAY 470

Maine Central Railroad steam locomotive number 470 quietly celebrated its 80th birthday last June 5th next to the friendly confines of the MEC freight yard in Waterville, Maine. The 4-6-2 Pacific was built by the American Locomotive Co. in Schenectady, N.Y., and was delivered to the railroad on June 5, 1924. The 470 has spent 40 years in retirement in a Waterville park as a monument to the days of steam in the state of Maine.

Basketball Hoop for suburban model home

While looking for an evening project, I decided to scratch-build a house with garage, and that a basketball hoop would really be a nice touch.

I chose a backboard with a round top. I made it five feet across and three feet tall. I painted the backboard white. The square is red and I added red trim around the entire edge of the backboard.

The hoop was hard to find. I finally ended up in the jewelry area at a local craft store. The package I bought is number "JDF 409 5mm JumpRing." There are 50 pieces in the package.

I glued a 1/8-inch block on the back of the backboard to give it a stand-off from the wall of the garage. The hoop is ten feet high. I made a scale ten-foot block, to set the backboard on, while the glue dried.

I haven't figured a way to have a net. My son suggested using fine fishing line. I am going to try that later this year.

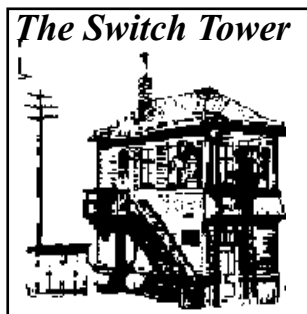
